The AOSR was shocked and sad to hear of Dr Hemant Patel's passing. Hemant was our AOSR Honorary Secretary 2025–2027. On the 25<sup>th</sup> June 2025, he had just officiated and provided the welcome address at AsiaSafe's MRI Safety Call For Action Series Part 3 webinar. Hemant was a tireless champion for the advancement of Radiology, a passionate advocate of the AOSR and a highly respected colleague.



He joined the AOSR council in 2021 and was appointed as Chair to the then AOSR Education Committee. From 2023-2025, he held the position of the Honorary Treasurer. He was also the Past President (2019) of the Indian Radiological and Imaging Association (IRIA) and subsequently the IRIA International Liaison Officer. He believed in building strong connections amongst the radiology community, whether locally (India), within the AOSR or internationally.




Hemant was soft spoken but always animated when articulating a point. These were captured at the new executive council meeting in January 2025, at the AOCR2025.


Hemant believed in building bridges and during his time in the AOSR, he strengthened the IRIA-AOSR bond.



# Getting to Know your AOSOR Youth Club Alumni - Dr Upuli Pahalawatta

The AOSOR Youth Club (YC) aims to provide an educational, social and academic program to foster future core leaders of the AOSR. Continuing this series, for this newsletter, we are delighted to present Dr Upuli Pahalawatta, FRANZCR. She is currently the Women's Imaging Fellow at Monash Health and also works as an honorary lecturer at the Central Coast Medical school, University of Newcastle

### When and where did you attend the AOSOR Youth Club?

I attended the seventh AOSOR Youth Club (the first after COVID-19) in Seoul, in September 2023, meeting many like-minded radiologists keen to contribute to their home societies and AOSR.



#### What was your biggest takeaway or the learning point or points from the YC?

While all of us came from a variety of cultural backgrounds and levels of seniority, the issues we faced as radiologists and as members of our college organisations transcend geographic boundaries. Key learning points included differences in the skill and priorities to run a successful radiology department vs a successful society.

Discussing issues facing us as radiologists such as the developing role of AI, the role of the radiologist in modern clinical practice with others allowed for creative brainstorming and provided opportunities to share creative solutions.

# Are you involved in any society or organization activity outside of your work as a radiologist? Be it locally or in regional or global organizations such as the AOSR?

At the time I was at AOSOR, I was involved in the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Radiologists as a member of the Trainee committee, serving on the transition subcommittee, which explored the potential hurdles presented by changing the entire training program.

I also serve as a reviewer for the RANZCR: Journal of Medical Imaging and Oncology as well as a reviewer for The Clinical Teacher.

# How has the YC helped prepare you for volunteering to serve in your home society or other related societies?

The leadership skills taught as part of the AOSOR YC in 2023 were divided into general and society specific skills. Both skills categories have served me well in both my day-to-day work as a senior registrar and now a fellow. A deeper understanding of leadership skills provides insight into organisational processes which are often opaque. Having this insight enables me to explain college and departmental processes to other trainees and allied health colleagues in a clear and understandable manner.

The networking, support and friendship offered to me by my fellow attendees at the 2023 AOSOR YC have been wonderful and invaluable as I progress through my career. If I need any advice or mentorship, I know that help is only a single call or message away, for sage wisdom and unwavering support.

# The 1st AsiaSafe MRI Safety Webinar, 29 April 2025

To kick off the magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) safety series from AOSR's AsiaSafe were two of AOSR's MRI Safety Ambassadors, speaking on 'MRI Safety: Bridging the Gap' and 'MRI Safety – Our Journey at Hong Kong Children's Hospital'.



Choorakutil Rijo Mathew is Chief Dr Radiologist at Amma Scans - Centre for Diagnosis and Preventive Medicine in Kochi, Kerala. Dr Elaine Yee Ling Kan is Chief of Service, Department of Radiology and Hospital Coordinator, Quality and Safety Office in the Hong Kong Children's Hospital (HKCH). Our AOSR president, Dr Chamaree Chuapetcharasopon gave the inaugural address with a welcome message to the MRI safety series by Professor Kwan Hoona Ng, founder and chair of AsiaSafe since its inception.

AOSR AsiaSafe's 'Magnetic Resonance Imaging Safety in Asia-Oceania: Call for Action" paper was published online in January 2025 in the Japanese Journal of Radiology. It outlined ten critical points to enhance MRI safety practices. Dr Rijo Mathew provided an overview of these key points to help spark discussions on the practical challenges and gaps in implementing MRI safety protocols.

Dr Elaine Kan shared the setting up, installation and commissioning of MRI Equipment in the HKCH, where she was a vital member of the commissioning team of the Department of Radiology of Hong Kong Children's Hospital (HKCH) and has been with the HKCH since service commencement in Dec 2018. She also spoke on how environmentally sustainable practices were also incorporated. The team involved those outside of the radiology department and MRI suite with training provided more than once a year. In addition, there was a "dedicated" cleaner/cleaning service for the MRI suite. This practice allowed the "cleaner" to be trained in MRI safety and regularly updated.

A robust question and answer session for the panel of speakers and moderators ensued which extended beyond time, but the questions and comments were insightful. MRI safety is important, and MRI incidents are blind to whether the MRI is sited in a high, middle or low resource region. Just a week prior to the webinar, media reported that in Finland, a floor scrubber was sucked into the MRI – fortunately no one was injured but the costs of repair to the MRI machine is at the time of this writing, estimated to hit 7 figures (Euro). More recently, a man who was wearing weight-training type of metal chain entered MR zone 4 and was pulled into a MRI machine, resulting in critical injuries and death.

The webinar lasted 1.5 hours and began at 6.30pm Indian Standard Time (9pm GMT+8). There were 150 attendees from 16 countries, 2 of whom were from outside Asia-Oceania. (322 had registered from 22 different countries, who would have been able to view the webinar for 2 weeks on the private platform.) Sixty-nine (69) answered the online feedback form at the end of the webinar. There was overwhelmingly positive feedback with 97% finding the webinar useful. More than 90% agreed that the speakers were clear, easy to understand and the content of their presentations were applicable to their practice.

# Magnetic Resonance Imaging Safety: Call for Action

Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) safety is a critical concern in the Asia-Oceania region, as it is elsewhere in the world, due to the unique and complex MRI environment that demands attention. This call-for-action outlines ten critical steps to enhance MRI safety and promote a culture of responsibility and accountability in the Asia-Oceania region. Key focus areas include strengthening education and expertise, improving quality assurance, fostering collaboration, increasing public awareness, and establishing national safety boards. By implementing these actions, we aim to significantly reduce MRI-related incidents and create a culture of safety across diverse healthcare settings in the Asia-Oceania Region. To address the growing concern of MRI safety, we urge the following ten-point call for action:

- Increase educational initiatives
- 2 Elevate expertise: organize continuous education, training and certification
- 3 Enhance public awareness and education
- 4 Encourage multidisciplinary collaboration
- 5 Promote knowledge and experience sharing
- 6 Strengthen quality assurance programmes
- Practice effective communication
- 8 Nurture a safety and no-blame culture
- Monitor advancements in interventional procedures
- 10 Establish national MRI safety boards / committees
